What is Human Trafficking?

Human trafficking is modern-day slavery and involves the use of force, fraud, or coercion to obtain labor or commercial sex. Every year, millions of men, women, and children are trafficked in countries around the world. This serious crime is not just a problem in other countries – it is also happening in the United States in urban, suburban, and rural areas.

Sex and Human Trafficking is the fastest growing illegal industry in the world; second only to the illicit drug industry. Every city in the United States is impacted by the scourge of human trafficking.

- Human trafficking is a global, \$150B industry; of that \$99B derives from sex trafficking
- Those trafficked for sex or labor make up 19% of trafficking services, but constitute 66% of trafficking profits
- In Texas, 300,000 individuals are trafficked each day and 80,000 are minors
- 1 in 3 child runaways is captured for prostitution within 48 hours

Human Sex Trafficking Myths

- Human trafficking is always or usually a violent crime.
- Human trafficking is always or usually a violent crime.
- Traffickers target victims they don't know.
- Only undocumented foreign nationals get trafficked in the United States.
- Only women and girls can be victims and survivors of sex trafficking.
- Human trafficking only happens in illegal or underground industries.
- Human trafficking involves moving, traveling or transporting a person across state or national borders.
- If the trafficked person consented to be in their initial situation, then it cannot be human trafficking or against their will because they "knew better."
- People being trafficked are physically unable to leave their situations/locked in/held against their will.
- Labor trafficking is only or primarily a problem in developing countries.
- All commercial sex is human trafficking.
- People in active trafficking situations always want help getting out.

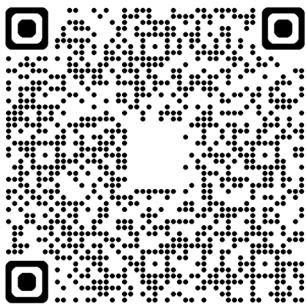
